ENGLISH VERSION

STATUTE OF THE CULTURAL ASSOCIATION “INVERSE TRANSHUMANISM”

ART. 1 - Name and Registered Office

The Cultural Association called “Inverse Transhumanism” is established in compliance with the Civil Code and current regulations. The Association is non-partisan and non-denominational. Its registered office is located in Rome, Vicolo del Grottino No. 13. The relocation of the registered office within the same municipality is decided by the Board of Directors and does not require an amendment to the statute. The Board of Directors may decide to establish operational offices, branches, or delegations in other Italian or foreign cities, provided they operate in accordance with the Association’s institutional purposes. The Association operates throughout the national and European territory, as well as internationally, by participating in projects, networks, and collaborations with public and private entities that share its objectives. The Association may join national and international networks, federations, and organizations with similar purposes, as well as promote cultural and scientific cooperation activities at a global level, in line with its statutory objectives, with particular attention to promoting Universal Evolutionary Ethics and the Constitution of Intelligences in the context of technological development and artificial intelligence. The Association has an unlimited duration.

ART. 2 - Purpose and Objectives

The Association pursues exclusively cultural, research, and dissemination objectives without profit. It aims to promote a vision of technological progress that places the human being at the center of scientific and digital development, ensuring that innovation is always guided by the values of freedom, dignity, and social justice. In line with the principles set forth in the Manifesto of Inverse Transhumanism, the Association seeks to spread and affirm an ethics of progress that is not merely regulatory or defensive but constructive and proactive, based on Universal Evolutionary Ethics, which directs technology toward enhancing human complexity. The Association promotes research, study, and dissemination of governance models that ensure a balance between human beings and artificial intelligence, preventing dystopian drifts and guaranteeing the ethical primacy of humanity. To this end, the Association supports the establishment of the Universal Court of Justice for Intelligences, a supranational body responsible for ensuring compliance with the principles of Universal Evolutionary Ethics in the design and application of advanced technologies. The Association fosters interdisciplinary dialogue between science, philosophy, art, and culture, promoting the production and dissemination of artistic, literary, and multimedia works that explore the relationship between humans and technology. To achieve its goals, it organizes conferences, seminars, exhibitions, educational workshops, research and dissemination projects, and collaborations with academic institutions, cultural and scientific organizations at the national and international levels.

ART. 3 - Activities



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The Association carries out cultural, educational, and scientific activities using all suitable means and tools to spread its values and objectives. It promotes interdisciplinary debate and awareness on topics related to innovation, the ethics of technological progress, and the relationship between humans and artificial intelligences, by organizing conferences, debates, training courses, research projects, publications, art exhibitions, artistic festivals, and public engagement events. The Association may also curate, promote, and disseminate artistic, literary, cinematographic, television, and multimedia works, as well as any other form of creative and educational expression in line with its objectives. For this purpose, it may use digital platforms, publishing tools, and all communication channels, including websites, social media, television channels, and streaming platforms. To achieve its goals, the Association may fundraise through crowdfunding initiatives, sponsorships, donations, and public and private grants, in compliance with current regulations. The Association may also enter into agreements, memorandums of understanding, and cooperation agreements with public and private entities, cultural, academic, and scientific institutions, companies, associations, foundations, enterprises, and national and international organizations. It may join associative networks and promote joint initiatives with institutional and governmental bodies that share its objectives and contribute to humanity's progress toward a conscious and ethically guided technological evolution.

ART. 4 - Members

Membership is open to natural persons and legal entities, including associations, organizations, and public or private institutions that share the Association's purposes and commit to achieving them. The members are divided into Founding Members: Those who participated in the establishment of the Association and ensure its strategic and value-based continuity. They cannot be excluded from the Association except in cases of serious statutory violations, which must be determined by the Assembly with a qualified majority of at least 2/3 of the voting members. Ordinary Members: Those who join the Association later, share its purposes, and participate in its activities. Ordinary members can be either individuals or legal entities (associations, organizations, companies). Honorary Members: Individuals, entities, or institutions that have distinguished themselves for special merits in line with the Association's objectives. Membership is decided by the Board of Directors. Rejections are not subject to appeal. Members lose their status due to voluntary withdrawal, automatic revocation for non-payment of membership fees (if applicable), unworthiness or behavior contrary to the Association's purposes, as determined by the Board of Directors. Any statutory amendments affecting the rights and prerogatives of the founding members can only be approved with their unanimous consent.

ART. 5 - Governing Bodies

The governing bodies of the Association are The General Assembly of Members, The Board of Directors, The President. Any modifications to the structure of the governing bodies must be approved by the Assembly with a 2/3 majority of the voting members. All social positions are unpaid.



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ART. 6 - General Assembly of Members

The Assembly consists of all members and is the supreme governing body of the Association. It Approves the financial statements and strategic guidelines, Elects and removes the Board of Directors and the President, Deliberates on amendments to the statute and the dissolution of the Association, Decides on appeals from excluded members. Decisions are valid at first call if at least half of the voting members are present, at second call regardless of the number of attendees. The Board members cannot vote on resolutions concerning financial statements or their responsibilities. The Assembly may be convened automatically at the request of at least 1/5 of voting members if the President or Board of Directors fail to convene it within the required timeframe.

ART. 6-bis - Meeting Methods and Online Voting

The General Assembly and the Board of Directors may meet both in person and remotely using videoconferencing tools or digital platforms, provided that the identity of participants is reliably verified, all members have the opportunity to speak and vote. The notice of meeting must include the access details for the chosen online platform. Voting via electronic means is allowed, provided that the identity of the voter is confirmed. In the case of online voting, the President of the Association or a designated member of the Board of Directors must verify the identity of voters and ensure the validity of the voting process. Decisions made through virtual meetings are fully valid and legally binding.

ART. 7 - Board of Directors

The Board of Directors is composed of an odd number of members, from a minimum of 3 to a maximum of 9, elected by the Assembly. At least 50% of the members must be chosen from the Founding Members, if available. The members of the Board of Directors serve a term of 5 years and are eligible for re-election. If elected from among the Founding Members, they serve a 10-year term and may be re-elected without limits. In the event of a vacancy, the General Assembly appoints a replacement, ensuring, where possible, the continuity of representation of the Founding Members. The Board of Directors administers the Association and oversees both ordinary and extraordinary management, prepares the financial statements, deliberates on all matters not reserved for the General Assembly, and may establish committees or working groups, defining their composition, functions, and operating methods. The President represents the Association legally and may delegate specific functions to members of the Board of Directors.

ART. 8 - President

The President is the legal representative of the Association and presides over the Board of Directors. The President's duties include representing the Association in external relations, convening and chairing the General Assembly and the Board of Directors, coordinating the Association's activities and ensuring the implementation of decisions made by the governing



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bodies, and overseeing the correct management of the Association in compliance with the statute and resolutions of the governing bodies. The removal of the President must be approved by the General Assembly with a two-thirds majority of voting members, unless in cases of voluntary resignation.

ART. 9 – Member Exclusion

Membership in the Association may cease due to voluntary resignation by the member, failure to pay the membership fee (if applicable) for more than two months, or unworthiness or behavior seriously contrary to the Association's purposes and values, including violations of the statute, decisions of the governing bodies, or actions damaging the image, assets, or interests of the Association. The exclusion of a member is decided by the Board of Directors, with a reasoned decision communicated in writing to the concerned member. Before the final decision, the member has the right to submit a defense within ten days from the receipt of the notification. The excluded member may appeal to the General Assembly, which makes the final decision by majority vote. Any membership fees already paid will not be refunded. Founding Members cannot be excluded, except in the case of serious statutory violations. The exclusion of a Founding Member must be approved by the General Assembly with a qualified two-thirds majority of voting members.

ART. 10 - Legal Audit

If necessary, the Assembly may appoint an auditing body composed of a registered statutory auditor.

ART. 11 - Assets and Economic Resources

The Association's economic resources come from membership fees, if applicable; donations and sponsorships from individuals, public and private entities; public and private contributions, national and international; revenues generated from the organization of cultural, educational, and scientific activities, including conferences, exhibitions, festivals, training courses, and other initiatives consistent with the Association's goals; proceeds from the sale of publications, artistic works, audiovisual, multimedia, and informational materials produced or promoted by the Association; funds raised through crowdfunding campaigns and other participatory financing methods; and any income from marginal and ancillary commercial activities related to the institutional purposes of the Association. The assets of the Association are exclusively intended for carrying out its associative activities and achieving its statutory objectives. The distribution, even indirectly, of profits or management surpluses to members, administrators, and collaborators is prohibited, unless they are allocated for institutional purposes or required by applicable regulations.

ART. 11-bis – Supporters and Patrons of the Association



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The Association may receive donations, contributions, and sponsorships from individuals, entities, and companies that share its objectives. Such supporters do not acquire membership status but may be publicly recognized as Supporters or Patrons of the Association, without voting rights or participation in governing bodies. The Association may establish recognition methods for supporters, such as public acknowledgments at events, in publications, or on the official website; certificates or merit awards for their support; and the opportunity to participate in cultural initiatives reserved for supporters. The donations and contributions received will be used exclusively to pursue the Association's statutory objectives in accordance with current regulations.

ART. 12 - Dissolution

The dissolution of the Association may be decided by an extraordinary session of the General Assembly with the favorable vote of two-thirds of the members. In case of dissolution, the remaining assets will be donated to entities with similar objectives.

ART. 13 - Final Provisions

For anything not explicitly provided for in this statute, reference shall be made to the provisions of the Civil Code and the applicable regulations on cultural associations.
